Fourth Suit Forcing (FSF) Alertable!

When you and partner have bid three different suits, a 4th suit bid is an artificial game forcing bid!

- Bidding a 4th suit says absolutely nothing about the fourth suit.
 - · The bidder could hold AKQ or just a singleton in the suit
- Promises enough HCPs to force game or better
- Both players must assume that the fourth suit is unstopped until either player bids NT

Why use Fourth Suit Forcing?

- You have a notrump-oriented hand with no "stopper" in the unbid suit
 - If partner has a "stopper" in the fourth suit, partner bids NT
- You don't have a notrump-oriented hand, but don't know which game to bid
 - Without FSF, you might be tempted to bid NT without a stopper in the fourth suit

Responding to FSF

- With a "stopper" in the fourth suit (and no void or singleton) bid 3NT, remember FSF promised enough to force game
- Without a "stopper" in the fourth suit, support partner's suit (if you have a combined 7 card fit)
- Unable to do either of the above, rebid your long suit
- When does FSF not apply?
 - The only exception 1C by opener, 1D by responder, 1H by opener, 1S by responder
 - This is natural and forcing only the round;
 - a jump to 2S would be FSF, a game force, and says nothing about spades (artificial and alertable)
 - Either you or partner are a passed hand
- > If you're not strong enough to make a game forcing bid ...
 - With a weak hand, you would have ...
 - made a suit preference for either of partner's suits (i.e., pass or rebid partner's first suit at the lowest possible level ... remember any rebid of a suit may be passed by partner)
 - With a moderate strength hand ...
 - no 8-card fit in either of partner's suits, and a "stopper" in the unbid suit (and no void or singleton) bid NT (remember any NT bid can be passed)
 - With support for one of partner's suits, a jump in that suit indicates your interest in a game
